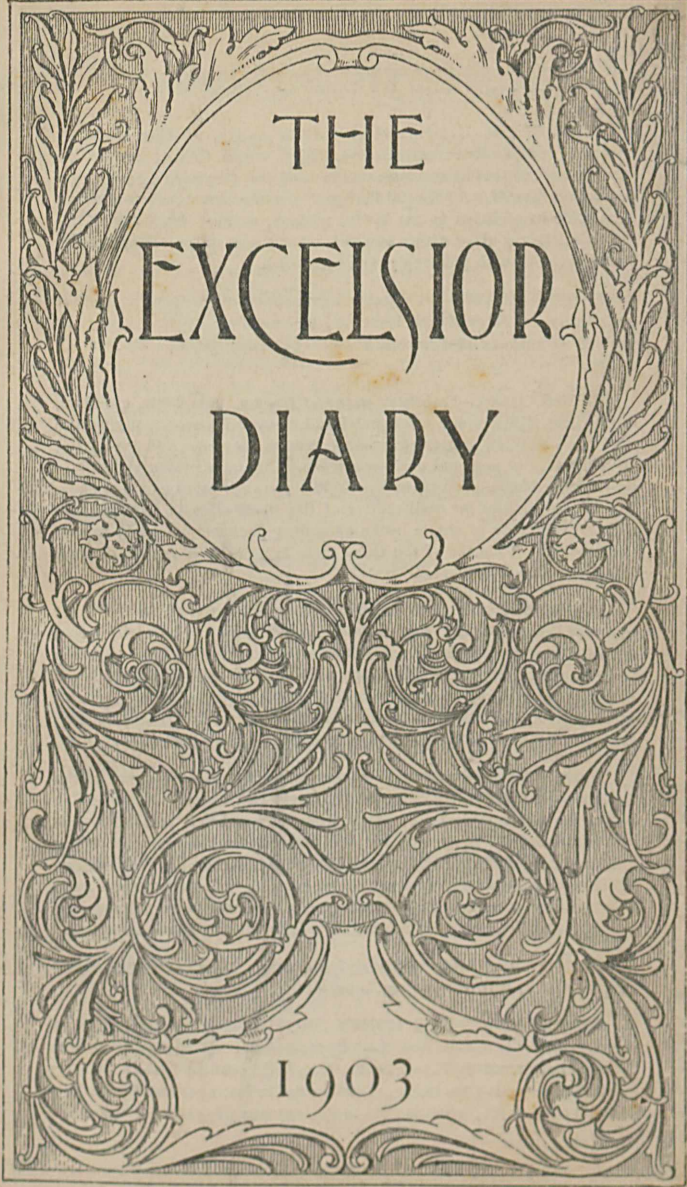

MONDAY 5

1903

Arrived at Philippopolis 11.30 A.M.
Saw Marie Beneva. Arrived Sophia 5.25
P.M. Penka, Marie Zgouff and Zlodka
were at the station. Mr & Mrs Crawford,
friends of Miss Gould's, got on at Sophia.
We had a very nice visit with them. Also
met an Italian from Constantinople, Mo-
modina.

SUNDAY 4

8.25 P.M.

Frijel, Olivia and Peggy with Jane.
Quite a family party.

TUESDAY 6

Arrived Belgrade 4 A.M. about. At Indjija
at 6. It's here you change time, 1 hour.
Had a false alarm about over inspection
of baggage. Arrived at Budapest 12.05. Left
at 1.05. Arr. Vienna 6.40. Had to wait
until 9.50 for our Dresden train - couldn't
get a sleeper so sat up all night in a
full compartment.

January

WEDNESDAY 7

1903

Arr. Dresden 7.00 A.M. There was Aunt W. to meet us. She took us to the Ripberger Pension. Had breakfast and a wash. Visited the gallery, saw the Sistine Madonna. Spent the rest of the morning seeing the different parts of the city. The shop windows were most fascinating. P.M. took a long drive with Miss Ripberger as guide. She is most entertaining. Went to the opera Carmen in the evening.

THURSDAY 8

Started for D. 9 A.M. Had a long, long day of travelling, went through Leipzig. Arrived at Huskum at about 11.30 A.M. Had a good dinner. Queensbow 5.30 A.M.

January

FRIDAY 9

1903

Queensbow 5.30 A.M. London 8.30. Uncle did then night enough. Found our trunk alright. Took a taxi to Imperial Hotel. Had breakfast. went out for a morning of shopping. Went to St. Paul's, Liberty's ^{Pillbox} & Robinsons. where we lunched. met Uncle mid at 1 + for our taxi ride. Went all over the place seeing things Westminster Hall in the House. Roman Catholic Cathedral, National Gallery, Richmond, Kew Gardens, Windsor, Dried Inockades with Uncle Robert, Theatre Pouterfly on the Wheel, supper Waldorf in the Blair. SATURDAY 10

Breakfast with J.B. packed. Left for Boston 11 A.M. Saw J.B. off for Gully with the Richards. We left 12. Uncle did + Aunt Do. saw us off. Very quick ride to twin pool. no stops. Twin pool 4 P.M. Saw Jack + Bernie. Sailed 5 P.M. Everything slipping.

January

SUNDAY 11

1903

Fine weather. Church 10.30. Met Mr. Briggs of N.Y. and Dr. Boyesen. Enjoying everything.

MONDAY 12

Played shuffle board and met Mr. Fairbanks, Mr. Shew, Mr. Francis, Mr. Thomas and some others, too many to remember. Noon weather getting rough. People retiring. Miss J. not feeling fit. Bought the paper and found news of the Alabama troubles.

January

TUESDAY 13

1903

Bad weather. Didn't feel quite myself until I got on deck. Miss J. is really under the weather. QR steadily worse, pitched very badly. I'm alright. Used the nails for every meal. The decks are deserted. I'm the only lady around. Get compliments from all quarters. Haven't met a single lady on board. Had some fun at chequers with Mr. Shaw. Nothing like a common complaint to make people friendly!

WEDNESDAY 14

Good weather again. People all turned up for breakfast. Miss J. is much better. Had some more shuffle board. Concert in the evening. Raised £14.

January

THURSDAY 15

1903

Hard sighted after dark. Took pilot
on board 10.30 P.M. On deck late
with Mr. Shaw + Capt. Longbottom.

January

SATURDAY 17

1903

Went up to College visited with Dr. Hiram
Saw various College buildings. P.M. Garden
party with musical dances. Met Miss
Fowle with lots of others.

FRIDAY 16

Landed 7.30 A.M. Cousin Fred + George
Rowell met us. Took a taxi across W. H.
left 10.02. Arrived Boston 4.00 in a
thunder storm. Mr. Jensen met us.
left for Wellesley 4.40 Arrived Wellesley
6.15. All splendid. Senior play in
the evening "The Sunken Bell".

SUNDAY 18

Baccalaureate service in A.M. Chapel
is beautiful. Wrote letters in P.M. Vesper
service in the evening. Beautiful.

January

MONDAY 19

1903

Sleep arising in the evening - Saw Miss Robinson
arranged to stay with her. President's
reception in the evening. Dr. Vivian took
me all round to meet everybody.
President Penellon, Mrs. Durant etc, etc -

Commencement day. Special ticket from
Dr. Vivian. Procession took 20 minutes to
get in. Lunched in College Hall dining room
with Miss Robinson. Met 1901 graduates,
dinner with Dr. Roberts, the Misses Watts,
Miss Helen French & Miss J.

1903

Tried to keep cool by sewing diligently.
In the evening refreshed ourselves with

Louise had gone off driving with Dr. Taylor.

MONDAY 10.

Finished E's blouse and steamed -
Canoeing in the evening with Ralph +
Ernest.

WEDNESDAY 12.

A.M. were shown over the Wellesley Banks.
Mrs. Jenison Sr. Mrs. Albany. Majorie
for lunch. Mrs. Albany and the best also

Took a beautiful trip through the Connecticut valley. Visited Mt. Tom, Smith College, Northampton; Amherst; Mt. Holyoke College, So. Hadley; didn't get home until 10 P.M. At Peterson lodge met Miss Bowen + Miss White, both remember Mrs. Bowen + Mrs. Panaretto.

February

MONDAY 17.

1903

 Evening played bridge. Found a great
 deal of foreign news that I have been
 looking for all these weeks in the
 Boston Transcript.

February

WEDNESDAY 25

Syrian picnic at the College grounds. Lennis at 5.15. Conversing with Ernest.

February

THURSDAY 26 7

1903

Prepared for the the-a-tre party. Saw about one passage home in the city and then called for Miss Ella Jensen + Marion. All had dinner in the city then gazed at shop windows until it was time for the performance of Mrs. Wiggs of the Cabbage Patch. Took an 11.20 p.m. train home.

Visited the P. Library. saw fascicles. Holy Grail Series and Saucant's Prophets - also Phillips Brooks monument.

FRIDAY 28. July.

1903

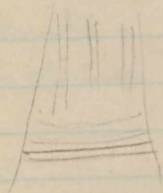
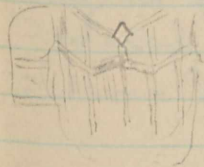
Went to the Methodist Church with Fred.

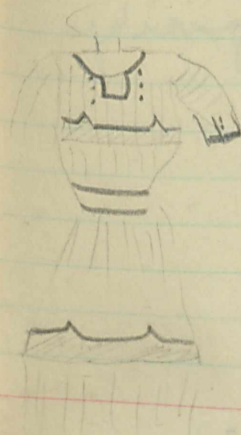
