CABLE: "CONCOLL", ISTANBUL TELEPHONE: 36-1 December 4, 1950. Memorandum to the Presidents of the Boards of Trustees of The American College for Girls and Robert College. In view of the critical situation in the Far East and the possibility o its rapid extension it has become necessary what measures we should take at the colleges in case the war should be extended suddenly to the Middle East. In case of such an emergency we propose to proceed according to the following general plan, in so far as such may be possible. For the present this plan is known only to the principal officers of th Administration of both colleges. It will be kept secret until such tim as it may need to be put into effect. I. The regular work of the colleges will be maintained as long as the Turkish government schools are open. If the government decrees that schools be disbanded, we shall close and prepare for partial or full evacuation of American citizents. We assume that the American Embassy will do its utmost to provide the means of evacuation if the situation seems to justify such action. 2. If schools are ordered closed because of the serious threat of war,

- 2. If schools are ordered closed because of the serious threat of war, we shall evacuate all who wish to leave at that time. But if military action should involve Turkey directly, we shall endeavor to evacuate all American citizens at both colleges with the exception of those who must stay to look after college property and affairs. In such an eventuality I think only the Bursar and myself should remain.
- 3. We would pay all local salaries and wages as far ahead as our funds available at the time would allow, preferably three months. With this possibility in view, we shall keep in reserve enough Turkish I to meet these requirements. This will make it necessary to draw from New York from time to time in order to maintain our local b
- 4. Because the property cannot remain unoccupied without risk of we shall endeavor to put it under the direct charge of the government authorities for protaction, at the same time tryin arrange for some of the Turkish members of the staff to live buildings. Naturally we cannot even discuss such a problem undemergency is upon us.
- 5. After all these measures have been taken, if thes city she to be in danger of immediate capture by the enemy, the Bursa would try to make our escape, for, under a communist regime, do nothing at all for benefit of the colleges or teachers.

This memorandum is being sent only to Dean Gildersleeve and It should be kept secret, for if it should get any publicity do us all much harm. Any suggestions which you may be able will be warmly welcomed.
