

From the Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Robert College
Board of Trustees

November 6, 1952

"The Chairman mentioned a proposal from Harold L. Scott, Dean and Vice-President of the College, and submitted by President Floyd H. Black to the Trustees, that Dean Scott and Mrs. Scott be permitted to build a two-family apartment on a plot of land near the College infirmary to be occupied by Dean Scott and Mrs. Scott and Mrs. Scott's aunt, Mrs. Middleton Edwards, with certain provisions. On motion duly made and seconded it was voted that Dean Harold L. Scott and Mrs. Scott be permitted to build a two-family apartment house on a plot of land near the College Infirmary, to be occupied by Dean and Mrs. Scott and Mrs. Scott's aunt, Mr. Middleton Edwards, with the understanding that on the death of all three the house should become the sole property of Robert College, but that during the lifetime of the three, or of any one or two survivors of the three persons named, the house should be fully at the disposal of any such survivor or survivors for occupancy or rental."

Dear Dean Scott,


Thank you for your letter of Feb. 21, 1953.

My dear Turgut,

I should like to ask you to do me a service if you find it possible.

Mrs. Scott and I, together with Mrs. Middleton Edwards, wish to build a house on Robert College property. The time is now near for my retirement from Robert College and Mrs. Scott and I would very much like to remain in Turkey if we can have a home of our own. The College will allow us to build on school property and the house will belong to the College when we pass on.

As the petition for permission to build is presented in the name of the College, a foreign institution, it is necessary for it to pass through the Ministry of Public Instruction and through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to the Council of Ministers. The petition was sent to the Ministry of Public Instruction some weeks ago and was passed on to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where it still is.

I wonder if it is possible for you to do something to get it acted on favorably in your Ministry. I should appreciate immensely any help you can give us. It should be emphasized that permission is being asked in the name of the College for a private house, not a school building.

I am sorry to trouble you with this matter, but it is an important one for us. We should like to pass our declining years in this our adopted country and building a house on College property will make this possible.

My dear Hazım Bey,

Thank you very much for your willingness to be of assistance to me in the matter of the permit for the house.

I am enclosing a copy of the petition for the permit, which has passed through the Ministry of Education with favorable mention and is now lodged in the legal department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Mrs. Scott and I are anxious to spend our last years in our "adopted" country - Turkey. We therefore have plans all ready for the building of a house on College property. Mrs. Middleton Edwards, my wife's aunt, will occupy one of the two apartments of the house.

The College administration is willing that we should build on College property, giving us the use of a plot of land. When the Scotts die off, as they must do someday, the house will become the property of the College.

Because the house is being built in the name of the College a special permit must be secured, which must pass through the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and receive final approval of the Council of Ministers.

The petition has been in the hands of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for some months now. As the building season has arrived we are anxious to get started.

If you could interview the legal department of this Ministry and find out just what the situation is I should be very grateful. The petition has been in the hands of Bay Talat Miras, Hariciye Vekaleti Birinci Daire Reisi and must be passed on by Bay Osman Dostel, Hukuk Müşaviri.

I have been unable to find out just what legal obstruction there is. There cannot be any objection in principle to the building of a house which is to be a domicile for a man who would rather spend his last days in Turkey than in the United States - even if the house is in the name of the College. It does not involve expansion of educational activities of a foreign institution, after all, which is what the educational law was supposed to guard against.

There is a precedent of a domiciliary building on College property. That is the Manning house, which was built in 1929, I believe. The conditions were exactly the same as those under which we hope to build.

I shall be most grateful for anything you can do to push this matter along.
